The Family Literacy Program provides language and literacy support to parents of students from non–English speaking backgrounds to provide a holistic approach to tackling literacy issues

Skills for Education and Employment (SEE)

Work Release Program

The Work Release Program assists inmates in NSW prisons, with less than three years left of their sentence, to participate in meaningful employment.

Minto Access Point (MAP)

MAP is a community assistance centre based in the Minto Housing Estate. MAP provides free internet access and referral, employment and training assistance. MAP has had significant impact on building social cohesion and increasing opportunity for thousands of residents in the Minto area.

Independent Employment Advisory Service (IEAS)

IEAS assisted students in Years 9-12 at-risk of disengaging from school, with school to work planning, mentoring and employment brokerage services. Funding for IEAS across NSW ceased at the end of 2013.

Warakirri College is an independent high school run by MTC Australia to provide opportunities for disadvantaged young people to undertake Years 10 -12.

Opportunity Hub
