

CHC30121 Certificate III in Childhood Education & Care



Who is this course for?

The CHC30121 – Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care course will teach you how to work collaboratively with educators to provide care and support to children. Successful completion of this course may lead to career opportunities as a family day care worker, early childhood educator, playgroup supervisor, team leader, childhood educator or childhood educator assistant.

There are no entry requirements for this qualification. However, you will need a current Working with Children Check and double COVID vaccination.

This course is available to all participants as a traineeship as well as under the Smart and Skilled initiative of the NSW Vocational and Educational (VET) system.

To be eligible for funding, you must:

- Be an Australian citizen, permanent resident or humanitarian visa holder
- Be aged 15 years or older
- Live or work in New South Wales
- Have left school and have no previous qualifications at Certificate IV or higher

You will require the Language Literacy, Numeracy and Digital skills to:

- Conduct basic internet research
- Engage in online learning, including video conferencing sessions
- Create simple word-processed documents
- Read and comprehend simple written documents and numerical texts

Participants must have access to:

- a computer or laptop
- word processing software
- the internet

Course Structure
